



NCF Repertoire Research Guide

PURPOSE

Part of the repertoire requirements for NCF 2022 requires that one piece must be written by an underrepresented composer. Many composers in classical music have been overlooked and discriminated against because of society's marginalization of their identities. It is important to realize that we have not yet heard the entire story due to the sidelining of these musical voices.

It is our responsibility as performing musicians to elevate diverse composers, arrangers, and artists, and raise awareness about their contributions to classical music.

This guide offers a starting point for researching diverse repertoire and learning about those who have not been represented historically in classical music, but it is necessary to understand that we each are accountable for our own education of underrepresented composers. We hope these resources are helpful and encourage us all to explore.
